
Purpose

To promote safe and healthy neighborhoods

- Identify and remove unsafe structures
- Target structurally unsound, vacant, abandoned, and/or condemned residential properties

Strategic Plan

- Initiative 1: Foster Community Development
- Goal: Ensure City has financial capacities to support development
- Action Item: Create and fund an Acquisition and Demolition Program to bank land for future development and remove dangerous structures for public-safety




Revitalization Neighborhoods Windshield Survey

- Street view property assessment
- Items assessed: foundation, illegal structures, fascia, windows, doors, yard/landscaping
- Categories:
 - Excellent
 - Good
 - Fair
 - Poor
 - Replacement
- Ratings based on estimated cost to repair vs. estimated home value



Revitalization Neighborhoods Windshield Survey

3,221 properties surveyed





Health and Safety Criteria

- Structural Deficiencies: deteriorating foundations, floors, walls, etc.
- Vacancy: must be vacant at least 1 year
- Police nuisance: multiple dispatch requests and trespassing violations
- Code Enforcement Violations: multiple health and safety violations
- Environmental Hazards: mold, asbestos, and/or lead-based paint
- <u>Properties selected for demolition must meet the structural deficiency and vacancy criteria plus one of the other three criterion</u>



FY 2018 Target Goals

- Demolish approximately 5 homes
- Leverage with existing programs/resources
 - –Make a Difference Day
 - -Home Repair
 - Neighborhood Toolbox
 - -Clean and Lien
 - -Infill Incentive



Community Impact

- Improvement of health and safety conditions in revitalization neighborhoods
- Anticipate an increase to property values
- Stabilization of the local housing and business markets
- Increase in shovel-ready redevelopment opportunities
- Ability to allocate City resources more efficiently
- Reduction in police and code enforcement dispatch calls and site visits
- Catalyst to increased communication and interaction with neighborhoods
