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2018 League Resolutions

- Guide the League's legislative efforts for next session
- Resolutions will be voted on by 91 Mayors at the Annual Conference on August 22nd
- 9 Resolutions proposed
 - Reviewed and recommended by Policy committees



League Policy Committees

- Budget, Finance, and Economic Development
- General Administration, Human Resources and Elections
- Neighborhoods, Sustainability, and Quality of Life
- Transportation, Infrastructure, and Public Works



Proposed Resolutions

- Allow city/town elected officials to transfer campaign contributions to a statewide or legislative office.

Support

- Allow cities/towns to appoint, by resolution, a designee of the Council to sign special event liquor licenses.

Support

- Require a candidate/entity that intends to receive contributions/make expenditures of over \$1,000 or less to file a signed exemption statement that states that intention before receiving contributions, making any expenditure, distributing any campaign literature, or circulating petitions. **Support**

Proposed Resolutions

- Pursue modifications to state and federal law to provide more options for local governments to regulate unstructured sober living homes in order to protect the health, safety, and welfare of sober home residents and the communities in which they are located.

Neutral

- Allow for street light improvement districts & parkway maintenance improvement districts that have a continuous border to be combined. **Support**
- Explore and support legislation for alternative transportation funding for cities and towns to operate/maintain roads. **Support**

Proposed Resolutions

- Support legislation that addresses the challenges with & discrepancies between the local boards of the PSPRS while reconvening the Task Force to make the administrative processes more efficient. **Support**
- Continue to research/analyze any modifications to CST to ensure municipal revenues are maintained, ensures local revenues are received at the location in which the construction activity occurs, provides simplicity for industry, and improves compliance. **Support**
- Urge Governor & Legislature to complete stabilization & balancing of State budget by eliminating current DOR surcharge. **Support**
