2018 League Resolutions

- Guide the League's legislative efforts for next session
- Resolutions will be voted on by 91 Mayors at the Annual Conference on August 21st
- 12 Resolutions proposed
 - Reviewed and recommended by Policy committees




League Policy Committees


- Budget, Finance, and Economic Development
- General Administration, Human Resources and Elections
- Neighborhoods, Sustainability, and Quality of Life
- Public Safety, Military Affairs, and the Courts
- Transportation, Infrastructure, and Public Works



Proposed Resolutions

- Pursue collaborative discussions with homebuilders on potential modifications to impact fees.
 - Seek legislation adding an economic presence standard, including reasonable thresholds in dollar amount and number of transactions addressing TPT for remote sellers.
 - Add support of federal legislation for the border crossing card.
- 

Proposed Resolutions

- Allow city/town elected official to transfer campaign contributions to statewide or legislative office.
 - Encourage Legislators to establish a legislative committee to explore resources for 9-1-1 funding.
 - Amend statute to allow for local regulation of short-term rentals through licensing, special permit, or registration at state or local level.
