Notice, the Clerk reported, was posted in accordance with law and that no protests had been received against granting the transfer.

Motion by Mr. Campbell: That the Council recommend granting said application for transfer to Jettie Robinson & Elsie Mathews. Motion was seconded by Mr. Tyler and carried by unanimous vote.

CANVASSING OF THE VOTES:

Abstract of Election Returns, signed by Thomas Aragon, Inspector of the Election Board, was received by the Council certifying that the number of electors voting at the Primary Election held on April 18, 1955 for the Nomination of Seven Councilmen, amounted to 247 and the number of ballots rejected were 11 and that the number of valid votes received by the 14 candidates were as follows: Frank E. Armstrong, 80; Russell H. Brinker, 166; Fred Campbell, Jr., 188; Leo N. Cooper, 42; Paul De Santi, 59; William E. Fulks, 162; Frank M. Geddes, 105; Wm. T. Holland, 124; Archie M. Kingsbury, 150; Arthur Martinez, 64; E. R. Schneider, 94; Hovel E. Smalley, 62; Homer B. Tyler, 128 and Hiram O. Wendling, 128.

After a thorough canvass of the ballots, the following Candidates were declared **NOMINATED** and the Clerk ordered to place their names on the General Election Ballot: Fred Campbell, Jr., Russell H. Brinker, William E. Fulks, Archie M. Kingsbury, Homer B. Tyler, Hiram O. Wendling and William T. Holland.

LOUD SPEAKERS:

After considerable discussion as to whether use of loud speakers should be regulated by specific ordinance dealing with this subject, the Council decided for the time-being to continue letting the Chief-of-police issue permits for their use

under certain conditions and to revoke such permits if in his discretion the use of such loud speakers become a public nuisance.

COIN OPERATED AMUSEMENT DEVICES - TAX:

The Town Attorney was directed to prepare an Ordinance providing for the taxing and regulation of Pin Ball Games and other amusement devices operated by coin - for consideration of the Council at the next regular meeting.

REPORTS:

Mayor Brinker suggested that the Council authorize him to write to the State Highway Commission to do whatever is required to be done to have Central Avenue between U. S. Highway 80 and West Van Buren Street designated a secondary roadway, which if so designated, would make said road eligible for Federal aid funds for paving.

A motion to this effect was made by Mr. Wendling, seconded by Mr. Campbell and carried by unanimous vote.



ABSTRACT OF ELECTION RETURNS

Sec. 55-714 ABSTRACT OF VOTE. At the time that the election board prepares the official election returns, it shall also prepare and certify in duplicate upon a blank provided for the purpose, an abstract of the number of ballots cast at the election, the number rejected in making the count, and the number of votes cast for each person for the several offices and for or against each proposed constitutional amendment and initiated or referred measure. One copy thereof shall be mailed or delivered at the time and as the official returns, and the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall immediately upon receipt make public the contents thereof. The other copy shall immediately be posted conspicuously on the outside of the polling place.
