

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Council of the City of Avondale, Arizona,
held at 7:30 p.m., Monday, December 16, 1963, in the City Hall.

Acceptance of Minutes of Previous Meeting.

Motion was made by Councilman Warner and seconded by Councilman Campbell that the minutes of the Regular Meeting of December 2, 1963, be accepted as reviewed by the Council as part of the Agenda for the Regular Meeting of December 16, 1963. Carried unanimously.

Canvass of General Election Votes.

The canvass of votes cast at the General Election held on Tuesday, December 10, 1963, was held at this meeting. The official returns were reviewed by the Council and are as follows:

Motion was made by Councilman Howe and seconded by Councilman Evans that the canvass of the General Election ballots be approved. Carried unanimously.

Special Council Meeting.

Following is Section 9, Article I of the Charter for the City of Avondale:

"INDUCTION OF MAYOR AND COUNCIL INTO OFFICE.

On the first business day in January following election, the Council shall have a meeting for the purpose of administering the oath of office to, and inducting the newly elected Mayor and Councilmen, and to organize the Council. At this meeting the Council shall designate one of its members as Vice-Mayor who shall serve in such capacity at the pleasure of the Council. The Vice-Mayor shall perform the duties of the Mayor during the absence or disability of the Mayor."

January 2, 1964, will be the first business day in January following the election.

Motion was made by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Warner calling a special Council meeting for January 2, 1964, for the purpose of administering the oath of office to, and inducting the newly elected Mayor and Councilmen into office. Carried unanimously.

Hearing on Application to Park Trailerhouse.

The hearing on the application of Thomas Jordan to park a trailerhouse at 42 Overlin Lane was held at this meeting. As per the City Ordinance, notice was posted on the property and all persons residing within 300 feet of the site were notified by letter. No protests have been filed with the City Clerk.

Motion was made by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Summers granting permission to Thomas Jordan to park a trailerhouse at 42 Overlin Lane. Carried unanimously.

Police Radio Service for Goodyear and Tolleson.

As per the Council's instructions, the City Manager sent a letter to the City of Tolleson and the Town of Goodyear in regards to the radio service that Avondale is furnishing both communities. City Manager Les Wishert of Tolleson and Councilman John H. Herrick of Goodyear came to Avondale to discuss the matter and asked what the wishes of the Avondale Council were.

The Council suggested that the City Manager figure out a monthly charge for Tolleson and Goodyear and contact them about same.

Aragon Request for Agreement to Use City Dumping Grounds.

Mr. Tony Aragon requested the City Manager discuss with the Council the possibility of an agreement whereby he may use the City dumping grounds to dump garbage picked up by Aragon's General Hauling.

As Mr. Aragon was not at this meeting to discuss this matter with the Council it was their decision that the City Manager figure out a fee and discuss it with Mr. Aragon.

Request for Water Service Outside the City Limits.

The City Manager received a call from Mrs. Asa R. Andrews of Route 1, Box 123AA, Tolleson, wanting to know if the City of Avondale could furnish City water to a development on 126th Avenue and Southern Avenue. The City Manager discussed this with the Public Works Superintendent and arrived at the conclusion that this area was too far from the City.

It was suggested by the Council that the City Manager discuss this matter with the people who are requesting the water service and find out what their plans are.

Right of Way for the Paving of South Central Avenue.

This was to advise the Council that the meeting of Wednesday, December 4th with property owners was very successful as people that attended were given detailed information as to the plans for the paving of South Central. As of last Wednesday, thirteen easements had been signed. Included as part of this Agenda was a copy of a letter the City Manager plans to send to property owners who did not attend the meeting.

Police Officer Completes Basic School.

This was to advise the Council that Police Officer Donald Cross completed a three-week basic police school receiving a 97% grade and a certificate for attending.

Demand Claims.

Motion was made by Councilman Campbell and seconded by Councilman Warner that the demand claims be accepted, as presented. Carried unanimously.

Chamber of Commerce Request.

Motion was made by Mayor Turner and seconded by Councilman Howe that the City of Avondale donate \$50.00 toward the Chamber of Commerce for the Christmas Lighting Contest. Carried unanimously.

Westside Little League.

Mayor L. R. Turner presented a \$100.00 check to Mr. Wayne Pigg, who accepted the check on behalf of the Westside Little League.

Certificates.

Mayor L. R. Turner presented Certificates of Election to newly elected Mayor John F. McCauley and Councilman Jack M. Warner.

Adjournment.

As the current business to come before the Council was completed, motion was made by Councilman Howe and seconded by Councilman Evans that the meeting be adjourned. Carried unanimously.
