Avondale

Purpose

- ▶ This presentation is to update the City Council on the reinstated Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP) by providing a brief presentation of the program, changes to the policy, work conducted to date, and requesting feedback.
- ▶ This presentation is for information and discussion. No action is required.

Program Steps

- ▶ 1. Initial Request
 - NTMP Service Request on NTMP webpage. Obligates “requestor” to conduct information and petition work.
- ▶ 2. Traffic Study
 - Staff determines locations for Traffic Study(s). Reviews findings against criteria for pass/fail.
- ▶ 3. Plan Development
 - Staff determines mitigation and locations. Speed cushions are typical first measure. Staff begins disseminating information to neighborhood.
- ▶ 4. Petition
 - Staff drafts, requestor circulates for approval. Offer: install temporary speed cushions
- ▶ 5. Construction
 - After 60 days, remove temporary, install permanent speed cushions.

Noteworthy Changes

- ▶ Initial request no longer requires six (6) additional resident's signatures
- ▶ Eighty-fifth percentile speed reduced from ten mph over posted speed limit to seven mph over
- ▶ Speed “cushions” are the “hump” of choice, to reduce impacts and delays to emergency vehicles
- ▶ Temporary speed cushions offered before permanent installations



Work to Date

- ▶ Revised Policy, Webpage, Service Request, and Information Booklet
- ▶ Backlog and new requests addressed; fifty-two (52) street locations studied.
- ▶ Five requests met program criteria for participation in the NTMP:
 - ▶ Durango Park – 113th Drive, Durango St to Whyman Ave; Petition completed, verifying signatures; 2 sets of speed cushions. Working to complete information dissemination.
 - ▶ Upland park – 108th Drive, Thomas Rd to Encanto Blvd, plus Encanto Blvd, 107th Ave to 108th Dr; 6 sets of speed cushions. Information and Petition circulation stage;
 - ▶ Glenarm Farms - Thomas Rd Frontage Rd, 103rd to 106th Avenues; 2 sets of speed cushions; Information and Petition circulation stage.
 - ▶ Historic Avondale - S. 7th St, Main St to E Harrison Dr; 3 sets of speed cushions; Information and Petition circulation stage.
 - ▶ Cashion - Pima/4th St, 107th Ave to 113th Ave; 6 sets of speed cushions; Information and Petition circulation stage.

Next Steps

- ▶ Durango Park: Verify signatures; conclude getting proposal information out to residents
- ▶ Continue Information and Petition efforts at remaining neighborhoods
- ▶ Continue working on new submittals
